

**Rogation Sunday** is celebrated on the Sixth Sunday of Easter because what follows are three Rogation Days on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. These 3 days are devoted to prayers asking for God's blessing on agriculture and industry (BCP p. 258). These days always precede Ascension Day, which falls on the 40th day after Easter, and celebrates the day the risen Christ is taken into heaven after appearing to his followers for 40 days.
